October 4-7 – The North Florida Land Trust is the beneficiary of the **Kayak/SUP Race at the Florida Surfing Championships** in Jacksonville Beach. You can watch the multi-day event at the pier. It includes exhibits, bands, an eco-village and, of course, surfing. Or you can participate in the five-mile ocean paddle, from just north of the Jacksonville Beach Pier to Atlantic Beach and back. It's not for amateurs, though! The race involves breaking waves, battling weather-related elements and challenging the mighty Atlantic while spectators cheer you on. October 6 – The Timucuan Preserve hosts **Harvest Day**, a special event marking the end of the harvest season at Kingsley Plantation. Visitors will experience life at a time when survival depended on nature's rhythms. From 10 am to 4 pm, demonstrations include cooking, blacksmithing and the harvest of Sea Island cotton and indigo. Visitors can help with butter churning, cotton ginning and producing indigo dye. The highlight of the day will be a cooking demonstration by culinary historian Michael Twitty.
